One Day Workshop on Innovative Methods of Teaching

A workshop on 'Innovative Teaching Methods' was organised by School of Education, Central University of Haryana, Mahendergarh on 3rd Aug, 2018.

Objectives:

- To expose the students with the innovative practices in teaching
- To make the students familiar with the innovative methods of teaching.

The programme was inaugurated with Lamp Lightning. Welcome address was given by Prof Bir Singh Yadav, acting Vice Chancellor of Central University of Haryana, Mahendergarh. He motivated the students to be creative and innovative. He talked about the importance of innovative practices in teaching- learning and its implementations in classroom. Without innovative practices teaching will become burden for students. He congratulated School of Education for organising such workshop on burning issue. Concept note of the workshop was given by Prof. Neerja Dhankar, TIC, SOE. She welcomed worthy Vice Chancellor and Resource Person and owed her gratitude towards both. She emphasized the emergent need of Innovative Teaching Methods in School Internship Program and in real classroom.





Dr. Devender Balhara was invited as resource person, to deliver lecture on innovative methods of teaching to students and the number of beneficiaries is approximately 200. In his lecture, he criticised the present education scenario. He challenged mark based system of education and competitive scenario of the examination system. He told that every teacher should read 'Fames of Mind' written by Gardner. He told the importance of Multiple Intelligence Theory given by Gardner. First of all teacher should recognize the ability of the students viz. musical, kinaesthetic, mathematical, spatial, linguistic, interpersonal, intrapersonal S/he must be good observer to recognise the abilities of the students. According the ability of the students, teacher should divide the class in groups and teach them accordingly. He told that teacher should connect the previous knowledge of the students with new learning. A teacher should be soft like mother and strong like father. He told that there is no need to teach the students but to create the environment for learning. Teacher must play the role of facilitator. Dr. Balhara also emphasised the role of parents in learning of the students. He told that parents should be cooperate and supportive not strict.
