Orientation programme on quality issues for teachers and students

Every year, Student Induction Program was organized for the students. The orientation program/ faculty induction program is also organized for all new faculty members. The sample copy is attached in the link.

Report on Online Student Induction Program:

A three week mandatory online Student induction program (e-SIP) was conducted for first year B.tech students by AICTE from 8 November 2020 to 13 November 2020 and 16 November to 20 November 2020 for the smooth curriculum conduction in professional colleges. All our first year B.tech students attended the online Student Induction Program. Dr. Pinki Arora Assistant Professor at SOET, Central University of Haryana (CUH) Mahendergarh was the convener of the Student Induction Program 2020 (e-SIP 2020)



On Sunday 8 November 2020, online inauguration of the program started at 10:45 a.m. Parents, students and faculty members from all over the nation joined the program. Manishi Mishra from ABES

Engg. College Ghaziabad and Umesh Yadav from Aurangabad, Maharashtra started the session. The program could be joined via webinar Zoom platform and through You-tube live streaming after the Zoom limit of 1000 was crossed. Students could put up their queries by raising their hands or put in the chat box. A pre-workshop survey was also to be filled before the program started. Each day an online quiz and assignment was also shared for the students to complete. Sessions took place in both the languages. Each day Time limit for assignment completion was from 1:30 pm of the running session to 9:30 am of the following day. 30000 registrations were received by AICTE. The following objectives of the program were outlined for the students:

- Exposure to a holistic vision of life.
- Awareness, sensitivity and understanding of Self---family---society---Nation---International---Entire Nature.
- Making bonds with peers, seniors, faculty and staff.
- Healthy lifestyle and ethical professional discipline.
- Pursuing other interest areas along with professional course.

AICTE Chairman Prof. Anil D Sahasrabudhe spoke to the students. He focused on students concern for placements and employment. He highlighted that professional courses are restricted not only to jobs but they should also focus on contribution of each student to society and upliftment of the weaker sections of the society. Universal human values also concerned him. Not only IQ but Emotional, spiritual and social quotient of the students should be developed. He introduced all the important sessions which ran for three weeks. UNNAT Bharat Program, creative practices, our ancient practices, 64 different art forms and especially NEP 2020, were deliberated by him. 'Sarve Jantu Sukhina', 'Vasudeva Kutumbakam' and UNESCO's Sustainable Development mantras were enthralled in his speech.

Prof. M P Poonia, Vice Chairman of AICTE also conferred the NEP 2020. He spoke on what initiatives have been taken by AICTE for quality education in the country. Reinvention of whole curriculum and learning content were focused by him. A short video of 1 minute 50 seconds on SIP was also telecasted.

Dr. Rajneesh Arora, NCC-IP Chairman, also spoke on NEP 2020. He also focused on UHVs, human thought, human culture with case studies and value guided skill education.

Convener of NCC-IP Dr. Shishir Gaur from IIT BHU Varanasi, specified that Students Induction Program is mandatory for all first year students to help them to adjust to new environment. A proposed schedule of the entire program was also shared.

Vice chancellor of Bikaner Technical University Prof. H. D Charan discussed the role of every technical student in social perspective.





Each college has its own special characteristics and every students needs to tune him/herself to it. Change is vital for every student. Too much perfection makes you weak.



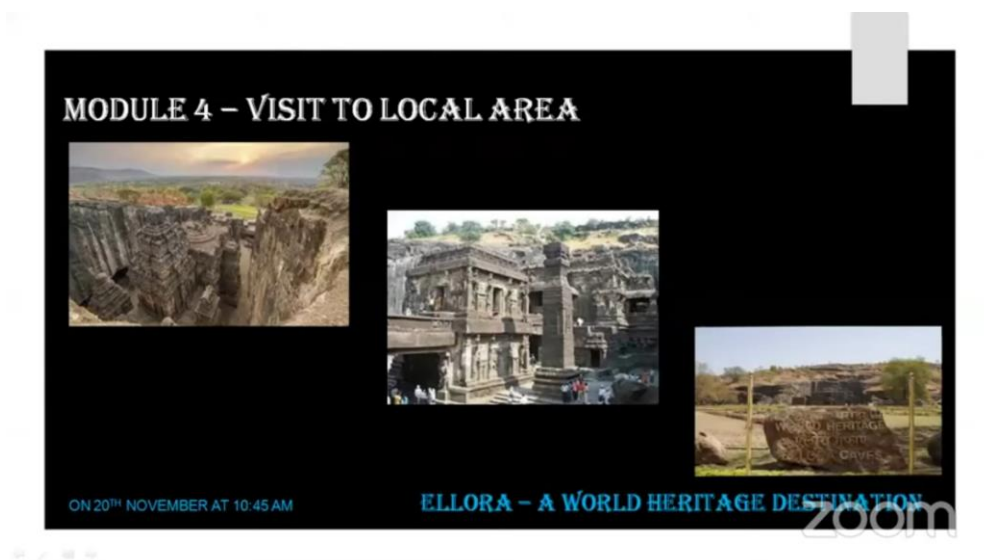
Concluding Day November 2020.

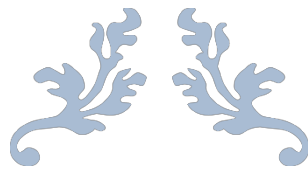

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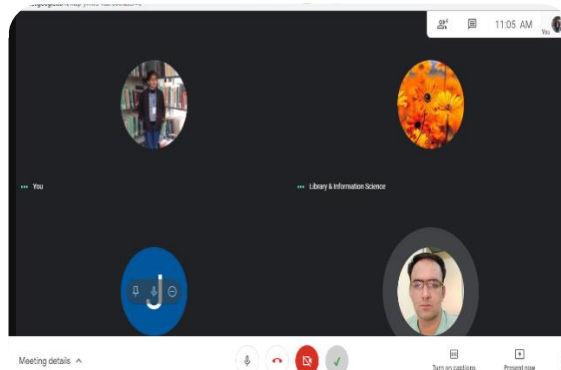
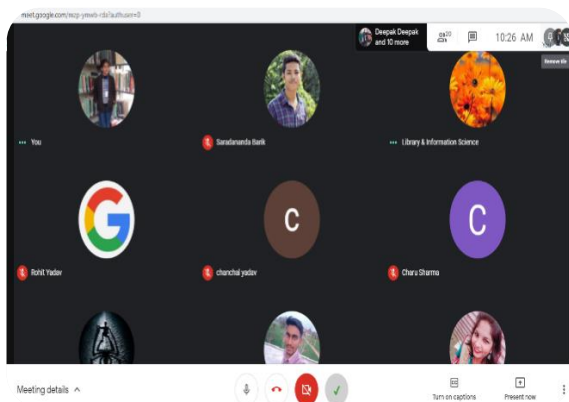

DAY 3: UNIVERSAL HUMAN VALUES

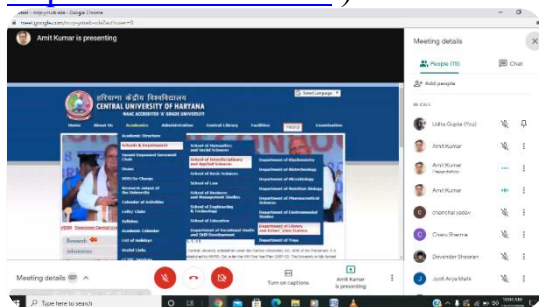

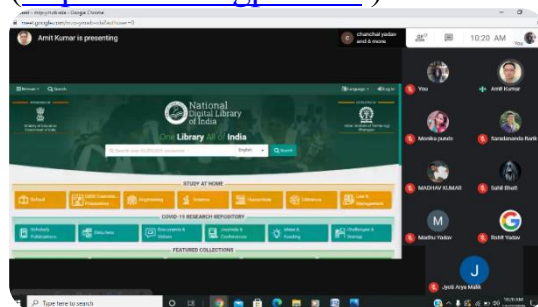
DAY 4: VIRTUAL CAMPUS VISIT
